APPENDIX – A [Computer Science & Tech(PG)]

Department of Computer Science & Technology. Goa University

Report of the Audit Committee(AAC) visit for A.Y. 2014-15 held on 19th June 2015.

The following AAC members were present for the full day meeting scheduled at the department from 10:00 AM to 5:45 PM.

- 1. Prof Bharat Deshpande, BITS Pilani Goa Campus
- 2. Prof Srinath Srinivasa, IIIT Bangalore
- 3. Prof Nutan Limaye, IIT Bombay

The committee members were accorded welcome by Prof. V V Kamat, HoD and other members of faculty present for the meeting.

This being the first Academic Audit(AC) of the department as well as being the first meeting of the newly constituted AAC, HoD in his presentation gave an overview of various programmes conducted by the department and the set of ordinances that are being followed which are different from the rest of the University. The course structures of MCA and M. Tech were presented and discussed at length. The faculty members present, shared their experience.

The committee members also met separately and independently both MCA and M Tech students and gathered their views on the manner in which programmes were conducted, and sought their suggestions on improving the course content and delivery.

The committee members were taken around the labs and classrooms and shown the facilities available to the department. AAC members went through the course & examination records of MCA and M.Tech progarmme held during the A.Y. 2014-15. The course wise records that were placed before the committee included – syllabus, attendance record & statistics, question papers of class tests and end sem, sample submissions, answerboooks, grade sheets and summary of course feedback obtained from students.

Overall, the committee observed that the department holds a good potential to provide quality education in Computer Science in the region but it has to seriously improve on its infrastructure and the faculty strength in the near future.

The observations/suggestions and recommendations made by AAC for MCA and M Tech are enclosed as Annexure-I (MCA) and Annexure-II (M Tech) respectively which could be acted upon by department and the University.

It is suggested that authorities take appropriate decision by initiating a dialogue with department faculty, and other stakeholders to stir the department towards excellence in research and teaching.

We thank the university and department of Computer Science & Technology for providing all necessary help in conducting the academic audit.
