Intl Symposium titled "Academic-Industry-Government Partnerships to Accelerate Radiation Research and Clinical Translation" held

Panaji, Oct 9 (UNI) A two-day international symposium on "Academic-Industry-Government Partnerships to Accelerate Radiation Research and Clinical Translation" (AIG 2018) was organized by Goa University, Gokarma Oncology Association, Nitte University, BITS-Pilani, Goa, and Indian Society for Radiation Biology on October 8 and 9 at International Centre, Dona Paula

Representatives of academic, industry and Government from across the globe met, did presentations and discussions and analysed the possible ways and means to improve the utilization of radiation for the benefit of common man in general and cancer patients in particular.
